John 8:48-59 (MAIN TEXT)

- **John 8:48-59** The entire passage is the primary focus of the sermon, with specific verses quoted and discussed throughout.
- **Revelation 3:15-16** "I know your works: you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth."

I will punish the world for its evil, and the wicked for their iniquity; I will put an end to the pomp of the arrogant, and lay low the pompous pride of the ruthless. I will make people more rare than fine gold, and mankind than the gold of Ophir. Therefore I will make the heavens tremble, and the earth will be shaken out of its place, at the wrath of the LORD of hosts in the day of his fierce anger."

INTERESTING NOTES

What does Yahweh reveal about God's character?

The name Yahweh reveals profound insights into God's multifaceted character. Yahweh embodies compassion, grace, patience, covenant love, and faithfulness, while simultaneously maintaining a commitment to justice and righteous judgment. While lavishly displaying mercy, God also faithfully fulfills his obligation to punish the guilty[1]. This is rooted in God's eternal and unchangeable nature—he is the One who always is, who has always been who he is, and who always will be who he is[2].

Fundamentally, Yahweh is self-existent—independent and owing his being to no one else. As Matthew Henry observed, while humans must say "By the grace of God I am what I am," God simply declares "I am that I am"[2]. This divine self-revelation calls faith communities to acknowledge God's multifaceted attributes and not selectively embrace only his merciful side. His grace cannot be taken for granted, and believers are warned not to "live close to the margins of God's patience"[1]. Ultimately, Yahweh is the God of covenant, who creates and preserves all things while sustaining his people according to his promises—making his name peculiarly significant as a representation of his covenant-keeping faithfulness[3].

DEVOTIONAL

Today we reflect on Jesus's profound claim, "If anyone keeps my word, he will never see death." This statement underscores the radical commitment required to follow Christ. Pastor highlighted that faith is not about comfort but about a life-transforming journey with God, where neutrality is not an option.

To embrace this, we must be "all-in" in our faith, seeking not our glory but understanding that true life comes from keeping His word. Just as Jesus did not seek His own glory but sought to honor the Father, we too are called to live lives that reflect His truth and love, understanding that our eternal life is secured in Christ.

- How do you interpret the concept of "never seeing death" in your own faith journey?
- In what ways can you "keep His word" more faithfully?
- What personal barriers keep you from fully committing to living for Jesus?
- Pray for insight and strength to understand and live by Jesus's teachings.
- Ask God to reveal any areas in your life where you may be lukewarm in your faith.

DEVOTIONAL

Today's reflection centers on Jesus's message about honoring the Father and the importance of living for God's glory rather than our own. As Pastor mentioned, Jesus invites us to a relationship based on love and not performance or fear.

This day encourages us to assess whether our actions honor God and whether we seek His glory above our desires. It's a reminder that true freedom and joy come from living a life that is devoted to God, where our actions are a testament to His love and truth in us.

- How can you ensure that your life is honoring to God rather than seeking your own glory?
- What does it mean to you to have a sonship relationship with God?
- In what ways can you reflect God's glory in your daily interactions?
- Pray for a heart that seeks to honor God in all things.
- Ask for the strength to live a life that reflects His love and grace.

DEVOTIONAL

- Pray to see Jesus's presence and fulfillment in your life daily.
- Ask for faith to trust in His promises, even when fulfillment seems distant.

DEVOTIONAL

Today's focus is on how faith calls us to be either all in or all out, with no room for being lukewarm, as Pastor emphasized. Jesus desires committed followers who are willing to surrender fully to Him.

This invites us to examine the state of our faith and challenges us to step off the fence. Will you crown Jesus or reject Him? The choice is yours, but neutrality isn't an option. Embrace the life-altering journey of faith, trusting that true fulfillment lies in complete devotion.

- What does full commitment to Christ look like in your everyday life?
- How can you inspire others to step off the fence and follow Jesus wholeheartedly?
